HONR110 -- Honors Seminar in Leadership -- “Leadership: Relational Empowerment” — (M/W/F 1:10pm-2:00pm) — 3 cr. — Profs. Lesa Dunn and Bryan Minnich

Leadership is a relational-intensive endeavor. If your people skills are not strong, neither will be your leadership. If you want people to follow you, then it is vital to build positive relationships. If people aren't following you, then you're not really leading. This course satisfies one Liberal Studies requirement in **Personal Awareness**. A student must be accepted into **Arete -- The KWU Honors Program** or have permission of the instructor to enroll in this course.

HONR250 -- Honors Seminar in Global Awareness -- “Learning and Applying the Lessons of the Holocaust” — T/R 9:25-10:40am — 3 cr. — Dr. Mike Russell

“Honors Seminar in Global Awareness” is a course with variable subtopics that provides honors students a platform where they will develop an appreciation for others and the importance of reaching beyond oneself. As is implied in the subtopic, this section of HONR250 will investigate the history and lessons of the Holocaust. In addition to learning the historical facts and evaluating what happened and why, students will determine what lessons can be learned from Nazi Germany and the Holocaust and how these lessons can be applied today. This course satisfies one Liberal Studies requirement in **Community and World Exploration**. A student must be accepted into **Arete -- The KWU Honors Program** or have permission of the instructor to enroll in this course.

HONR310 -- Honors Issues — (days/times TBA) — 3 cr. — Dr. Meredith Drees
