Trustee Scholarship \$19,000 (off-campus \$16,000)

- High school seniors with cumulative GPA of 3.7
- Transfer students with GPA of 3.7 in 24 or more transferring graded credit hours

Presidential Scholarship \$17,000 (off-campus \$14,000)

- High school seniors with cumulative GPA of 3.5
- Transfer students with GPA of 3.5 in 24 or more transferring graded credit hours

Academic Excellence \$15,000 (off-campus \$12,000)

- High school seniors with cumulative GPA of 3.3
- Transfer students with GPA of 3.3 in 24 or more transferring graded credit hours

Dean's Scholarship \$13,000 (off-campus \$10,000)

- High school seniors with cumulative GPA of 3.0
- Transfer students with GPA of 3.0 in 24 or more transferring graded credit hours

University Scholarship \$8,000 (off-campus \$5,000)

- High school seniors with cumulative GPA from 2.5-2.9
- Transfer students with GPA of 2.5-2.9 in 24 or more transferring graded credit hours

Promise Scholarship \$6,000 (off-campus \$3,000)

- High school seniors with cumulative GPA from 2.0-2.5
- Transfer students with GPA of 2.0 in 24 or more transferring graded credit hours



- Ad Astra Scholarship: This is a minimum guarantee of \$60,000 in undergraduate scholarships over four years (\$15,000 per year). KWU guarantees this amount, at minimum, to any graduate from a Kansas high school or home school, those who transfer from a college in Kansas or state resident.*
- Saline County Scholarship: This is a minimum guarantee of \$70,000 in undergraduate scholarships over four years (\$17,500 per year). KWU guarantees this amount, at minimum, to any high school/home school student who resides at an address in Saline County and is new to KWU.*
- Central Kansas Scholarship: This is a minimum guarantee of \$70,000 in undergraduate scholarships over four years (\$17,500 per year). KWU guarantees this amount, at minimum, to any high school or home school student who resides at an address in the following counties: McPherson, Ottawa, Ellsworth, Lincoln, Dickinson, Marion, Reno, Cloud, Harvey or Sedgwick.*
- Phi Theta Kappa: Any transfer student who is a member of Phi Theta Kappa is eligible for additional merit aid of \$1,000.
- Discretionary Scholarships: Offered through activities such as athletics, fine arts, or academics. Amounts vary and are determined by coaches or sponsors.
- State Line Plus Grant: Any high school or home school students from Missouri, Nebraska, Colorado, Texas and Oklahoma qualify for a \$2,000 State Line Grant.
- Rebecca Chopp Transfer Scholarship: The scholarship is designed for eligible transfers (24 transferring hours, 2.5 cumulative GPA, non-activity) who exhibit academic achievement, community service and leadership capabilities. Awards range from \$2,000 to \$10,000 per year. See your Admissions counselor for more information.





2024-25 Scholarships and Awards

50% Legacy Scholarships: This 50% tuition scholarship is available to children and grandchildren of Kansas Wesleyan University, Marymount College or St. Mary of the Plains College alumni. Recipient must be a full-time, on-ground new undergraduate student.

50% United Methodist Scholarship: This 50% tuition scholarship is available to all members of the United Methodist Church. The scholarship opportunity applies to full-time, on-ground new undergraduate students.

Transfer Nursing Scholarship: Junior Nursing transfer students who qualify for admission to both the university and its Nursing program can earn up to \$30,000 of institutional aid! Exact award is dependent upon transferring GPA.

Salina Regional Health Center Employee Scholarship: Similar to the Ad Astra and Central Kansas Scholarships, this is a guarantee to certain individuals affiliated with Salina Regional Health Center (SRHC) of at least \$20,000 in scholarship aid per academic year! Qualifying individuals must be an SRHC employee, spouse or dependent under the age of 25 still living in the employee's household.*

Stein Strings Scholarship: The Stein Strings Scholarship guarantees strings players — new to KWU from a Saline County school — at least \$20,000 per year in institutional aid!*

Kansas Advancement Scholarship: This scholarship guarantees any Kansas community college graduate at least \$20,000 per year in institutional aid!*

DECA Scholarship: This scholarship will focus on students joining DECA. Multiple scholarships will be awarded.

Bill McMosley Music Scholarship: This is a scholarship in memory of longtime KWU music instructor Bill McMosley, for students participating in music at KWU. Multiple scholarships will be presented.

Barbara Marshall Theatre Scholarship: This scholarship is in honor of long-time KWU professor Barbara Marshall. Multiple scholarships may be awarded.

Dr. Dorothy Hanna Scholarship: This scholarship is in honor of long-time KWU professor, Dr. Dorothy Hanna. Multiple scholarships may be awarded to incoming STEM students.

Gary Harmon Debate Scholarship: This scholarship is in honor of long-time KWU debate coach Gary Harmon. Multiple scholarships may be awarded to incoming Debate and Forensics students.

Coyote Enrollment Day: Incoming students must attend a Coyote Enrollment Day. To recognize their attendance, they will receive a \$1,000 scholarship.

ACT Scholarship: All incoming students with proper documentation of a 21 ACT score (or higher) will receive a \$1,000 scholarship.

^{* =} These scholarships are not stackable with other financial aid; e.g. a Dean's Scholarship recipient from Kansas earning \$2,000 in discretionary funds will not be guaranteed an additional \$15,000 per year. Other specific rules and limitations may apply for certain scholarships.
