Thank you for submitting your 2024-25 FAFSA. 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| 2 If you are legally marr but are separated from your spouse, you do not need to report your spouse's income on your FAFSA, but you must follow the instructions the right. | a. Your marital status from "Married" to "Separated", b. If you have included your spouse in your Household Size, deduct your spouse from that number and enter the corrected number. 2) Provide evidence to the Student Financial Planning Office that you are separated from your spouse. A copy of a legal court document will suffice. |

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The FAFSA requires tax and income information based on your marital status as of the date you filed your FAFSA. We must include tax and income data on the FAFSA correctly determine your awards.
